Stick to the Script

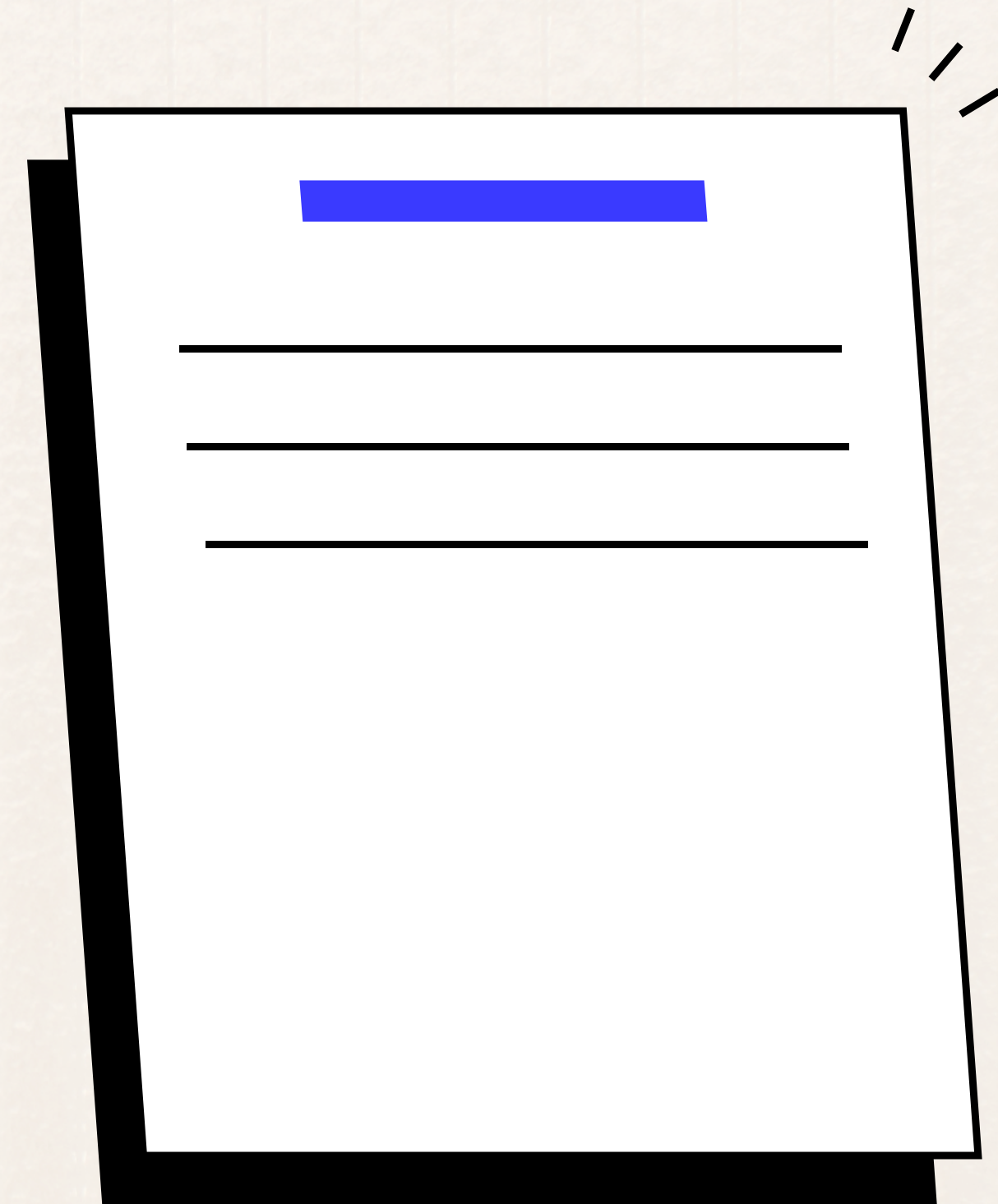
"I will not speak without my attorney present."

"I do not agree to this search."

- dated

- signed by a judge
- correct address
- dated

To the Indiana University Police Department. 1. Address Book and Contact Information
 - a. Any names, phone numbers, email addresses, or other contact details stored within the phone.
2. Stored Email Messages
 - a. Emails sent, received, and drafted, including attachments, metadata, and associated account information.
3. Stored Text Messages
 - a. SMS and MMS messages, including message content, metadata (timestamps, recipients, and senders), and attachments.
4. Call Logs
 - a. Records of outgoing calls, including phone numbers, timestamps, and call durations.
5. Incoming Call Logs
 - a. Records of incoming calls, including phone numbers, timestamps, and call durations
6. Photographs and Other Media Files
 - a. Stored images, videos, and graphics
7. Evidence of Ownership of Control
 - a. Data or metadata indicating the identity of the person(s) using or in control of the phone, such as usernames, account logins, profiles, or saved preferences.
8. Other Stored Information Relevant to the Investigation
 - a. Any other data, such as app data, OPS location history, browsing history, or social media activity

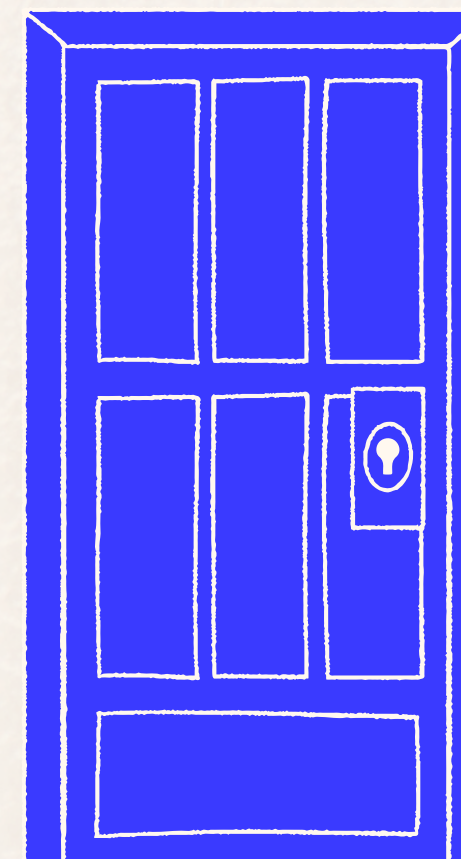

What Can I Do About an ICE Detainer?

1. You or your loved one can contact the local public defender office, your criminal defense attorney, or a local immigrant rights organization:

- Before asking for bail
- Before paying bail
- For help asking to be released from jail, especially if you paid bail, your case was dismissed, or you have finished your sentence

2. If you feel comfortable, you or someone else can ask the jail to release you.

3. Speak with a local public defender or immigrant rights organization about filing a motion in court for your release from jail.

4. Talk to an immigration attorney to get advice about your immigration situation and options. You or your loved ones can look for a trusted immigration attorney or representative on the Immigration Advocates Network legal directory.

| Documentation proving how long you have been in the USA (especially if you have been here for more than 2 or 10 years) | Proof of education (if you studied in the US) |
